Fieldwork teacher evaluates the student in the classroom using the <u>Fieldwork Evaluation Form</u>.</p> <p>General Methods (2800) – same placement as 2070.</p> <p>Children's literature (2400) - same placement</p> | <p>Semester II: Spring</p> <p>Fieldwork Hours: As required by instructor.</p> <p>Courses: EDUC 2110, 3080, 3110, 3130, 3490, 3550</p> <p>Students schedule fieldwork through course instructor or at partner schools.</p> <p>Evaluation: Course instructor provides and evaluates assignments related to fieldwork. Fieldwork teacher evaluates student with <u>Fieldwork Evaluation Form</u>.</p> |
| <p>Semester III: Fall</p> <p>Fieldwork Hours: Up to 50</p> <p>Courses: EDUC 3290, 3550 Other Courses: 3010, 3030, 3050, 3540</p> <p>Student's specialty area, Kindergarten, EDUC 3290 or Middle Level, EDUC 3550. Students will schedule fieldwork through course instructor or the Education Placement Office.</p> <p>Fieldwork teachers use <u>Fieldwork Evaluation Form</u> and students maintain fieldwork log.</p> | <p>Semester IV: January-April</p> <p>Student Teaching – 14 weeks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Eight weeks in Grade 1-6 • Six weeks in specialty (K or Middle School) <p>Evaluation: Cooperating teachers and college supervisors evaluate students using the Education Department Student Teaching Evaluation Form.</p> |
