



Baccalaureate Degree Programs at the College of St. Catherine: Transfer Guidelines for Minneapolis Community & Technical College

About the College of St. Catherine

Located in St. Paul, the College of St. Catherine has a superb reputation and is the nation's largest catholic women's college, educating students to lead and influence. At St. Kate's you can choose from 56 majors, 45 minors, plus another 37 majors/minors through our affiliation with the ACTC consortium. It's hard to find this kind of variety at other colleges our size. Check out the complete list of majors and minors. The Weekend College option offers degrees in 15 major fields by attending courses every other weekend. Our Minneapolis campus is a two-year, co-educational institution specializing in health care and human services. Look for more information located in the private college filing area of the MCTC counseling center.

Transferring Credit

Although completing the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum or an AA/AS degree at MCTC will not in itself satisfy the core curriculum requirements at St. Catherine, these courses generally transfer and will be evaluated individually. Please review the attached Course Selection Guide to ensure you are choosing MCTC courses that will fulfill St. Catherine requirements. This course guide is intended only for students pursuing a bachelor's degree: Students planning to attend an associate degree program on St. Catherine's Minneapolis campus will have different requirements. St. Catherine admission counselors are more than happy to meet with you to evaluate your transcripts, explain how your courses meet St. Catherine requirements, and make recommendations for registration at MCTC.

Previous college coursework must be at the college level (1000-level or higher) and a grade of C- or better must be earned. Pass grades are accepted. There are not a maximum number of credits that will transfer to St. Catherine's, however; a minimum of 48 credits in residence must be completed at St. Catherine's for students who transfer in 57 or more credits. For students who transfer in less than 57 credits, a minimum of 64 credits must be completed at St. Catherine's.

Applying to Baccalaureate Programs

St. Catherine has "rolling admission" and therefore there is no application deadline. A minimum 2.0 GPA is required. Students must submit an application, application fee, and official transcripts from each high school and university. ACT, SAT, or PSAT scores are not required for admission. Students interested in Nursing have an early "petitioning" deadline of March 1st. Contact a counselor at St. Catherine's to plan your transfer.

Transfer Scholarships for Baccalaureate Students

Academic Achievement Award, \$3500-5000 (\$1200 WEC with GPA of 3.3-3.49 and \$1,500 with GPA of 3.5 or above).

Annually renewable, transfer admission GPA 3.0.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship, \$3000 (\$1800 WEC). Annually renewable.

Scholarship for students who know a St. Catherine graduate, \$600 (\$300 WEC). Referral card required with application.

DupliKate Scholarship, \$2000 (\$1200 WEC). Daughter or granddaughter of alum, annually renewable.

Family Scholarship, \$1000 per family member (Day or WEC). Sister, mother, etc., renewable while attending simultaneously & full-time.

International Student Scholarship, \$3000-10,500 (Day students only). Competitive; application required.

Students are not limited to one scholarship award, and many other sources of financial aid are available (scholarships, grants, loans, and student employment). Contact St. Catherine to find out how a private education can be affordable for you and to meet with a financial aid counselor. "WEC" denotes amounts for Weekend College students.

Transferring from Mpls Community and Technical College to the College of St. Catherine

The Department of Nursing at the College of St. Catherine educates students in associate, baccalaureate and graduate programs to be leaders. The Department of Nursing fosters learning through caring relationships and interdisciplinary collaboration, is committed to the centrality of the liberal arts, and celebrates and reflects the diversity of our society.

The upper-division nursing major, located on the College's St. Paul campus, is offered in four semesters for students in the day section, in four semesters in the weekend/evening section for students who have earned a previous baccalaureate degree, and in three terms for students in Weekend College (registered nurses only). While the curricular outcomes are the same for all three sections, the three-term weekend curriculum is built on competencies attained through associate degree nursing education. Evaluation of curricular outcomes is assessed through several quantitative and qualitative measures.

Liberal Arts and Sciences Coursework

Liberal Arts and Sciences requirements and acceptable MCTC courses are listed on a separate Transfer Guidelines / College of St. Catherine handout available in the MCTC counseling center. Please refer to this handout frequently and ask an advisor if you have any questions. When considering the liberal arts and sciences requirements, remember that nursing majors can choose either the B.A. or the B.S. degree.

ADMISSION TO THE BACCALAUREATE DAY NURSING PROGRAM: GENERAL INFORMATION

All nursing candidates students must submit the nursing major application materials by a specified deadline in order to be considered for admission. Candidates should contact the Nursing Department at 651-690-6585 to receive application information.

Students are selected for the nursing major from a pool of qualified applicants based on the following priority considerations:

1. Students who have entered the College as first-semester students.
2. Students who transfer to the College prior to beginning the major (these students will be selected based on a combination of two factors: number of courses taken at the College and cumulative grade point average). Students seeking a first degree and students seeking a post-baccalaureate major/second degree will be considered simultaneously.
3. Students who transfer to the College for the major.

Residency Requirements

To earn a St. Kate's degree, you must complete a certain number of credits "in residence"- i.e., courses you registered for through the College of St. Catherine. Entering students with fewer than 57 semester credits must complete 64 semester credits in residence. If you enter with 57 or more semester credits, you must complete 48 semester credits in residence. In all cases, students must complete in residence 24 of their last 32 semester credits and one-half of the credits in their major.

Baccalaureate Day Program Nursing Transfer Guide For Courses from Minneapolis Community and Technical College

Admission to the Major: Day Section

In order to begin upper-division courses in the nursing major, you must meet the following criteria:

1. Successful completion of prerequisite courses (C or above), with a prerequisite GPA of 2.6. No prerequisite course may be taken S/U. If a prerequisite course grade is C- or lower, this course (or an alternate course approved by the associate dean for nursing programs or baccalaureate program director) must be repeated no more than once. A minimum grade of C must be achieved in the repeated or substituted course. If two or more prerequisite courses are C- or lower, the student is ineligible for the nursing major.
2. An overall GPA of 2.75 (calculated on all courses including failed courses, completed within the past ten years). Students who are ineligible for the nursing major because of their GPA may be reconsidered on an individual basis by petitioning to the Baccalaureate Program Committee on Students.
3. Completion of 64 semester credits.

Students possessing a baccalaureate degree have the choice of pursuing either a second degree or post-baccalaureate major certificate in nursing. Both require fulfillment of prerequisite course work with 2.6 GPA, and overall cumulative GPA of 2.75. However, students pursuing a second degree must fulfill all graduation requirements for the College of St. Catherine in addition to course work required for the nursing major. Students completing a second degree or post-baccalaureate major certificate are eligible to take the state licensure exam and receive public health certification.

Other requirements to be fulfilled prior to entering the nursing major include:

1. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification
2. Certified nursing assistant (CNA) certification
3. Current immunizations

Weekend Program Nursing Transfer Guide (Registered Nurses Only) For Courses from Minneapolis Community and Technical College

ADMISSION TO THE MAJOR: WEEKEND COLLEGE SECTION

In order to begin upper-division courses in the nursing major, you must meet the following criteria:

1. Minimum grade of C in all nursing courses.
2. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 (calculated on all courses, including failed courses, completed within the past 10 years). Students ineligible for the nursing major because of GPA or nursing course grades may be reconsidered on an individual basis by petitioning to the Baccalaureate Program Committee on Students.
3. Completion of 100 semester credits with no more than eight credits of core liberal arts or elective credits remaining.
4. Previous work experience as a registered nurse (R.N.) or be currently employed as an R.N.

The major in nursing can be obtained with either a B.A. or B.S. degree. Students who already have an associate degree in nursing and a baccalaureate degree in another major may pursue either a second degree or post-baccalaureate major certificate in nursing. (The second-degree option is not available to graduates of the College of St. Catherine.) Post-Baccalaureate major certificate students need to satisfy major requirements only, including the supporting course. Second-degree students must meet all graduation requirements for the College of St. Catherine, in addition to course work and a supporting course required for the nursing major. Courses completed at other regionally accredited institutions may often be accepted as meeting degree requirements.

Other requirements to be fulfilled prior to entering the nursing major include:

1. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification
2. Registered Nurse (R.N.) licensure in Minnesota
3. Current immunizations

Evaluation of curricular outcomes is assessed through several quantitative and qualitative measures.

Liberal Arts and Sciences Coursework

Liberal Arts and Sciences requirements and acceptable MCTC courses are listed on a separate Transfer Guidelines / College of St. Catherine handout available in the MCTC counseling center or on the College of St. Catherine Transfer Guide website. Please refer to this handout frequently and ask an advisor if you have any questions. When considering the liberal arts and sciences requirements, remember that nursing majors can choose either the B.A. or the B.S. degree.

ADMISSION TO THE BACCALAUREATE POST-BACCALAUREATE NURSING PROGRAM: GENERAL INFORMATION

All nursing candidates students must submit the nursing major application materials by a specified deadline in order to be considered for admission. Candidates should contact the Nursing Department at 651-690-6585 to receive application information.

Students are selected for the nursing major from a pool of qualified applicants based on the following priority considerations:

1. Students who have entered the College as first-semester students.
2. Students who transfer to the College prior to beginning the major (these students will be selected based on a combination of two factors: number of courses taken at the College and cumulative grade point average). Students seeking a first degree and students seeking a post-baccalaureate major/second degree will be considered simultaneously.
3. Students who transfer to the College for the major.

Residency Requirements

To earn a St. Kate's degree, you must complete a certain number of credits "in residence"- i.e., courses you registered for through the College of St. Catherine. Entering students with fewer than 57 semester credits must complete 64 semester credits in residence. If you enter with 57 or more semester credits, you must complete 48 semester credits in residence. In all cases, students must complete in residence 24 of their last 32 semester credits and one-half of the credits in their major.

Evening/Weekend Post-Baccalaureate Program Nursing Transfer Guide For Courses from Minneapolis Community and Technical College

Admission to the Major: Post-Baccalaureate Section

In order to begin upper-division courses in the nursing major, you must meet the following criteria:

1. Successful completion of prerequisite courses (C or above), with a prerequisite GPA of 2.6. No prerequisite course may be taken S/U. If a prerequisite course grade is C- or lower, this course (or an alternate course approved by the associate dean for nursing programs or baccalaureate program director) must be repeated no more than once. A minimum grade of C must be achieved in the repeated or substituted course. If two or more prerequisite courses are C- or lower, the student is ineligible for the nursing major.
2. An overall GPA of 2.75 (calculated on all courses including failed courses, completed within the past ten years). Students who are ineligible for the nursing major because of their GPA may be reconsidered on an individual basis by petitioning to the Baccalaureate Program Committee on Students.
3. Completion of 64 semester credits.
4. Completion of a baccalaureate degree

Students possessing a baccalaureate degree have the choice of pursuing either a second degree or post-baccalaureate major certificate in nursing. Both require fulfillment of prerequisite course work with 2.6 GPA, and overall cumulative GPA of 2.75. However, students pursuing a second degree must fulfill all graduation requirements for the College of St. Catherine in addition to course work required for the nursing major. Students completing a second degree or post-baccalaureate major certificate are eligible to take the state licensure exam and receive public health certification.

Other requirements to be fulfilled prior to entering the nursing major include:

1. Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification
2. Certified nursing assistant (CNA) certification
3. Current immunizations
